

Annual Grant Giving Review 2020



Making More of Every Gift



£108,807 grant funding has been awarded to 40 different local charities, voluntary organisations and Community Interest Companies in Greater Manchester



54 projects including community groups, homelessness, learning disabilities, refugees, older people, young people, children and vulnerable families have been supported

The Charity Service has been a registered charity (No. 1011293) since September 1990 although our origins go back to 1924. We manage four Trust Funds - the Charity Service Discretionary, Manchester & Salford Medical, Pennington Bequest and Chronicle Cinderella - that provide grant funding opportunities to other charities, voluntary organisations and CIC's operating within the Greater Manchester area.

This review focuses on the four Trust Funds, the grant funding provided to organisations and its impact during the period April 2019 to March 2020.

Grant Funding

Grant funding of £108,807 was awarded to over 40 charities, voluntary organisations and CIC's delivering 54 different projects within Greater Manchester and these charities have supported a wide range of client groups as shown in the graph below.

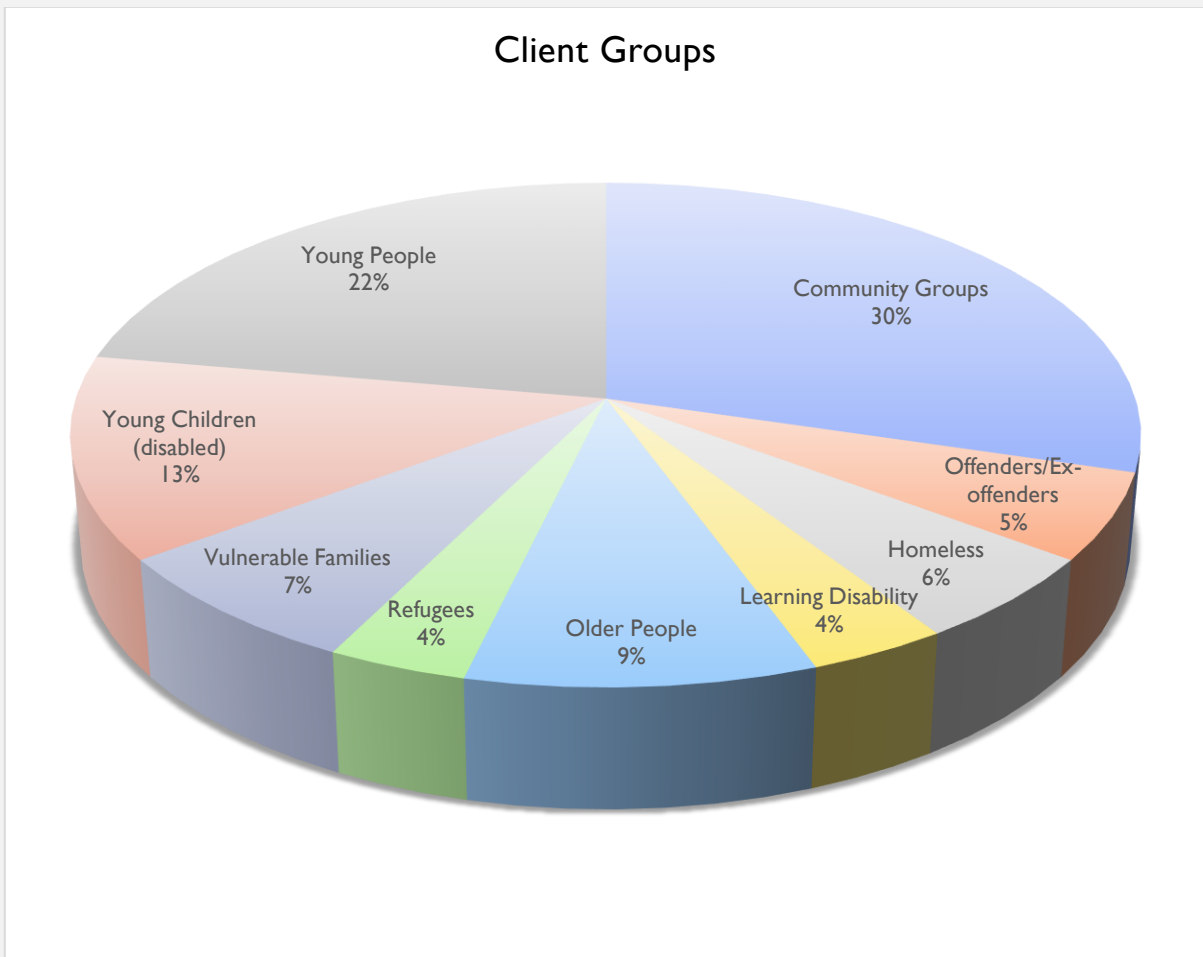

Grant funding has directly and/or indirectly supported 2,136 people at an average of £51 per person from a wide range of client groups and circumstances including:

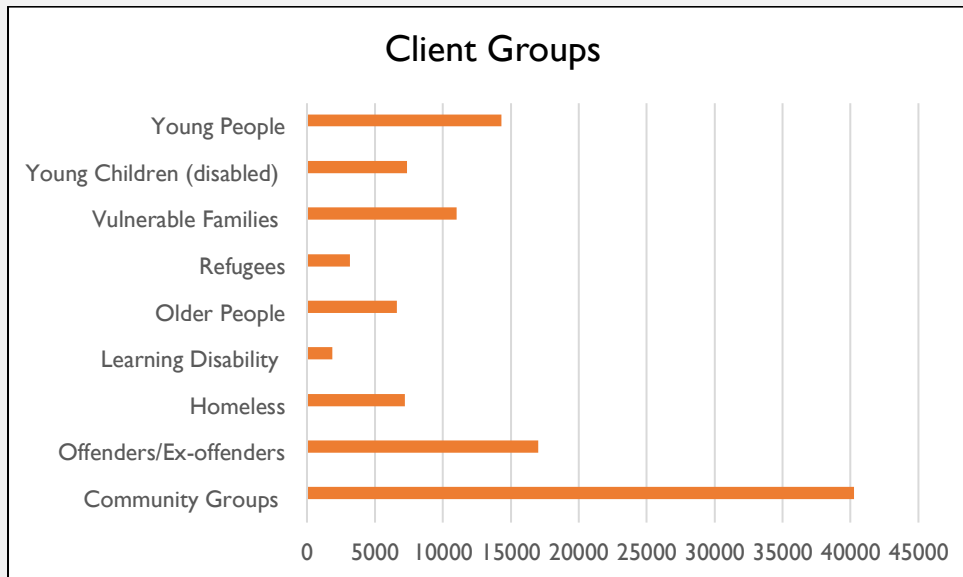
